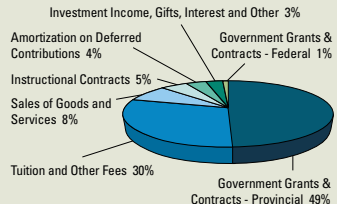

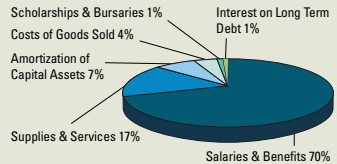

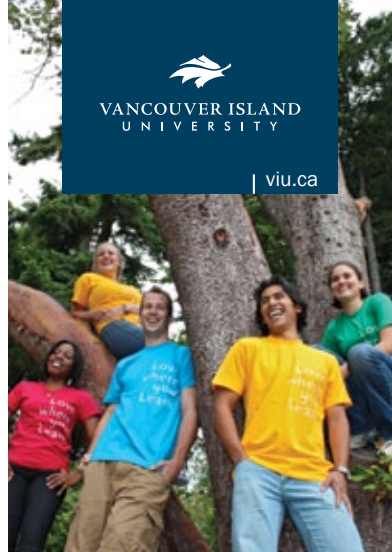

Established in 1936 as a vocational training school, VIU has evolved into a dynamic, internationally known university. In addition to serving Canadian students, VIU also offers a successful International Education program that in 2008/09 attracted over 1,200 students from many different countries.

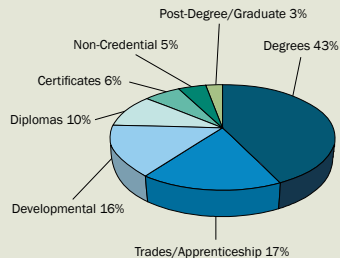

Library

The Library is housed in an impressive new facility on the Nanaimo campus that integrates comfortable study and meeting spaces with the latest in learning technology. It also hosts the bookstore, the VIU Teaching and Learning Centre, the Writing Centre and IT Services. Book and journal collections are supplemented by a wide range of electronic resources including indexes, databases, electronic journals and electronic books that are available to students and faculty twenty-four hours a day.

Economic Impact

In 2008, VIU employed 2,325 people with total salaries paid of over \$64.1 million. This includes all employees from casual workers to student workers to full-time faculty members.
