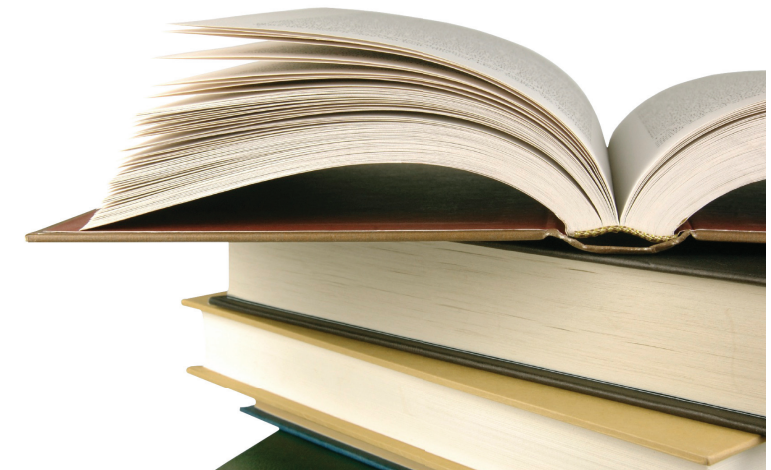

### Admission Guidelines

Guidelines will be used as a benchmark for assessing academic excellence - three "As" and one "B" in Grade 11 academic studies. While it is anticipated that most applicants will excel academically, it is also understood that some students may have special skills and qualifications not identifiable through high school grades. Staff in schools must be cognizant of the fact that students will need to have the academic ability to be successful in a post-secondary setting.

### Tuition Fees

A \$200.00 tuition deposit is required by June 30, 2010 to confirm seats for both the Fall 2010 and Spring 2011 terms.

The balance of tuition is due October 1, 2010 for the Fall 2010 term and February 1, 2011 for the Spring 2011 term. Fees are subject to change without notice.
