ANTHROPOLOGY INTERNSHIPS SPRING 2012: NANAIMO MUSEUM

Up to four internships with the Nanaimo District Museum are available to Anthropology Major students during the Spring 2012 term (Anth. 493A). Students must be available to work at the Nanaimo District Museum and/or local archives and libraries during their regular hours.

Curatorial Research Assistants: Two internships available

Working under the supervision of the curator, each student will research and develop a digital video presentation for exhibition use. The two topics are: The Nanaimo Bathtub Race (revise the existing exhibit to create a more complete story) and Harmac Pulp Mill (a 5-6 minute audiovisual presentation about the mill and its relationship to Nanaimo).

Exhibit Research Assistants: Two internships available

Working under the supervision of the curator, students will research and develop a single case outreach exhibit. The two topics are: Cameras (as communications tools from the 1920's to today) and Radios (as communications tools from the 1920's to today.)

To apply for any of these positions, send a one-page letter to the Anthropology Department Chair, Gay Frederick, including information on your GPA, courses or projects that you have taken which demonstrate skills that can be applied to the position, and state why you should be selected. Applications will be ranked and vetted by the Anthropology Department Faculty for final approval by the Director of the Nanaimo District Museum.
