- Vancouver Island University *Application for Admission Form*
- Personal Profile
- Min. GPA of 4.0 ("C+") (Post Baccalaureate most recent 60 credits attempted, Bachelor of Education most recent 48 – 60 credits attempted.)

Notes on Admission

- Applicants to the Post Baccalaureate Secondary Program may be given preference with discipline specialties in

high need areas such as mathematics, languages, physical sciences, First Nations and special education.
