Malaspina High School (MHS) is part of a unique learning community in Canada. Although MHS is a private high school, it shares facilities, resources and instruction with Vancouver Island University, a public university of 10,000 students. MHS is the only learning model of its kind in Canada and provides opportunities for MHS students to use university labs, libraries and technology as learning tools within a nurturing high school environment. Classes are taught by dedicated British Columbia certified teachers in an intimate setting.

Active Learning

Malaspina High School students learn inside and outside of the classroom, gaining practical, real-world experience. Beyond their classroom studies, Tourism students coordinate and deliver adventure and eco-tourism programs. Leadership practice involves students in community leadership opportunities and exposes them to problem-solving and project management. A Peer Helper program develops interpersonal and mentoring skills.

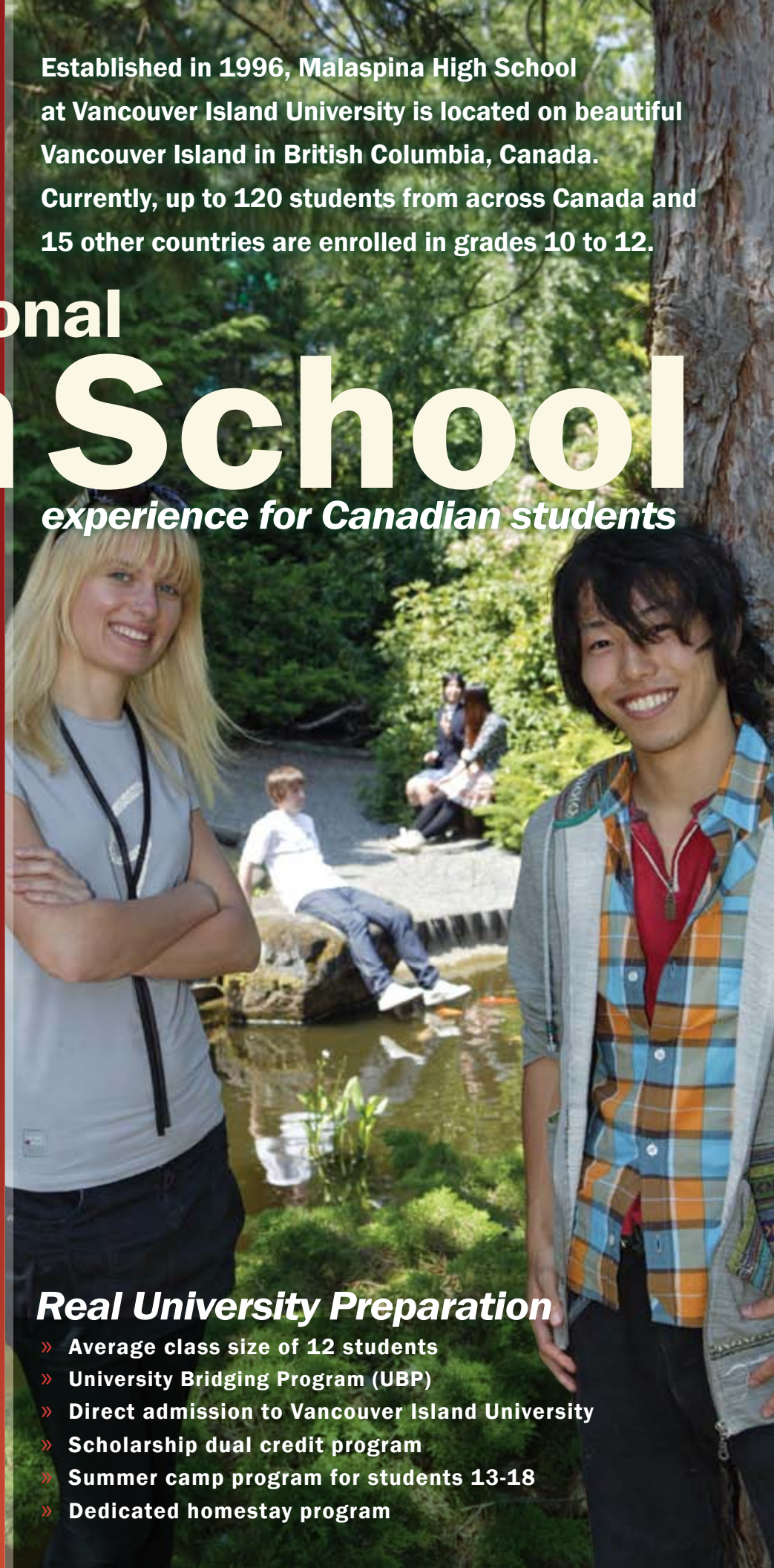

Graduation Requirements

In order to graduate with a Dogwood Diploma, every student in the Graduation Program has to pass certain basic courses: 48 credits from required courses and 32 credits from elective courses. Students must also write the BC Provincial Examinations.
