### The Bishop's Gospel Choir of British Columbia First Nations Technology Fund

In October 2009, the Right Reverend James Cowan, Bishop of British Columbia, authorized the Bishop's Gospel Choir to establish a new project: the Bishop's Gospel Choir of British Columbia's First Nations Computer Technology Fund.

The purpose of the Fund is to raise the necessary money to award laptop computers to First Nations post-secondary students residing within the Diocese of British Columbia. Each computer awarded will be a new laptop equipped with licensed MS Office Student Edition (including Word, Excel and PowerPoint) loaded onto its system. A printer will also be provided with its software loaded onto the computer. The computer will be fully "plug and play". The laptop will be wireless capable and will also include a protective carry case.
