The B.A. Major and Minor in Indigenous/Xwulmuxw Studies are products of a collaboration between Vancouver Island University and the First Nations of Vancouver Island and Coastal British Columbia. Their purpose is to provide comprehensive, high-quality education respectful of the cultures of Indigenous peoples, while meeting their diverse needs.

- explore contemporary Indigenous issues in an integrated, multidisciplinary manner;
- prepare students for living within Indigenous societies and the larger world;
- allow students to pursue the widest possible variety of professional specializations;

- emphasize links with local First Nations communities and organizations, governments, and educational institutions that give students maximum opportunity for success;
